

WAYMAKERS' SWING FOR KIDS GOLF TOURNAMENT RAISES \$105,000 TO BUILD SAFER COMMUNITIES IN ORANGE COUNTY

Annual Tournament at Oak Creek Golf Club Supports Youth Shelter, Victim Assistance, Crisis Counseling, and More

Irvine, Calif. (May 16, 2025) – Waymakers, a nonprofit committed to creating safer and stronger communities across Orange County, raised \$105,000 at its annual Swing for Kids Charity Golf Tournament on May 15. Held at Oak Creek Golf Club in Irvine and presented by Purus Wealth Management, the event welcomed 148 golfers for a meaningful day of fundraising in support of Waymakers' life-changing programs.
